MLSC TREASURERS REPORT 2022 - 2023 SEASON

I would like to give thanks to the many members who have taken on roles to support and grow the many facets of the Mornington Life Saving club.

A quick summary of our financial position as at 31 March 2023:

CASH POSITION: Balance of \$270,651 as at 31st March 2023 up from \$48,172 last year

INCOME: for the year was \$300,433 – a \$15k increase on the \$284k from last year.

Membership income was \$15k higher than last season.

Membership: Total \$82,622

- This was a 20% increase on last season. Note also, membership income in 2011 was \$28,340 demonstrating the significant growth in our membership.
- Special thanks to Nicole Warner who provides enormous support club-wide on registrations, all grant applications, equipment purchase fulfilment, payment approvals amongst a long list of other activities.

Grant Income: received \$34,259 compared to \$81,996 last season.

• Thank you to Life Saving Victoria, SLSA, Bendigo Bank Mt Eliza, South East Water, DHL, AMP, Mornington Peninsula Shire, and the Victoria State Government.

Kiosk & BBQ: Income of \$53,205 up from \$45,986 last year

- Thanks to Xiara and the team providing a great food and beverages option for our members.
- Special thanks to John for his continued efforts to source produce, run setup and pack up and provide support and guidance to our volunteers.

Schools Program: Income of \$40,612 with some of these being revenue owed from last season.

• Thank you to Ciara McAuley, Jac Morrow, Kelly Parrish, Mark Cornish and all the 18-person strong team for coordinating the Program.

Water Training Fees: Income \$15,600 was down from \$23,655 last season, likely due to lower numbers.

- Thank you to Ange Seaburgh, Adrian Lynch, Travis Sutton, Simon Williams, Adam McCrow and especially Matt & Lisa McConnell for all your coaching support. The results speak for themselves.
- Thanks also to the youth instructors. It was great to see our teenagers continue to help train the nippers. For many of them this is their first job, and they did a fantastic job overall.

Uniform: \$13,708 similar to last season.

• A fantastic effort by our merchandise manager Tash Carah who managed all the purchasing, inventory, and sales on behalf of the club.



EXPENDITURE: Year End \$275,280 compared to \$287,849 last season.

• The team did a wonderful job in controlling expenses given the increase in income and activity at the club this season.

Equipment repairs: \$21,136

• Investment in additional first aid training equipment, new nipper boards & marquees

NET SURPLUS/(DEFICIT) for Year: \$25,153

• We are a not-for-profit club and aim to put all earnings back into the club to enhance our members' experience and provide a valuable service to the community. The committee and the leadership team at the club has achieved that this year.

MLSC PRESIDENTS REPORT 2022 – 2023 SEASON

I would like to start by thanking all the hard working volunteers for their efforts over the 2022-23 season - Mornington Life Saving Club's 109th year. It is great to be able to present my President's report, celebrating the positivity and renewed energy that accompanies running a season without the formidable challenge of COVID-19. After enduring the hurdles brought on by the pandemic, we have emerged into the next chapter, with a renewed appreciation for our life saving club and what it has to offer.

Our patrol teams, coaches, athletes, and members have been able to fully immerse themselves in the pursuit of continuous improvement, unencumbered by the logistical and health-related concerns that faced us in the recent past. The return to normalcy has sparked a surge of enthusiasm, and a shared commitment to return to what we enjoy while further enhancing our programs, expanding our offerings, and ensuring a more inclusive experience for all members.

Being able to participate again in important club events such as a full patrol season, the Mooloolaba September Camp, the January Twilight Swim, the ability to compete at Life Saving carnivals and just meeting with friends at Mills Beach through the many activities held on a weekly basis makes you grateful for our club and the environment we create together.

I would like to take the opportunity to acknowledge the outgoing committee for their fantastic efforts and support in a productive season – Adel Peterson, Terry Shrimpton, Wes Roach, Kelly Parrish, Stewart Lockie, Simon Williams, Ange Seaburgh, Adam McCrow, Adrian Lynch, Liz Lancia, Michael Degg, Rich Morel and Tash Carah. I would also like to thank our Club Admin Nicole Warner who continues to provide tremendous support to the committee and all members alike, while securing financial grants to assist with the club's growth and equipment.

Lastly to our members. I would like to thank you personally for being part of the Mornington Life Saving Club and the passion and support demonstrated throughout this season.

Financial

We had a strong result for the year with the P&L resulting in a surplus of \$25,153 including our cash balance positive by \$48,172 and a cash on hand result of \$270,651. The bank accounts remain in a positive position as we managed expenditure closely while still investing to maintain services for our membership and maintaining our equipment. Thank you, Wes Roach, for all your hard work and guidance over the last year delivering another fantastic result. Please see further details in Wes's Treasurer's Report.

Patrolling

We again experienced large numbers visiting Mills Beach over the summer with five patrol groups providing a safe water environment for 49,446 people that attended during 3,512 patrol hours for the 2022-23 season. Terry Shrimpton led an amazing group of patrol captains as we were able to get back to some consistency with Covid restrictions lifting. Thanks to our patrol captains Terry Shrimpton, Stuart Mathews, Amy Veale, Rich Morel, and Nicola McKinnon. Also, a big thanks to all members who have patrolled in season 2022-23 where we have seen a 15% increase in required patrol hours and to those who have jumped in to fill vacant patrol positions and ensure we meet our requirements – your efforts do not go unnoticed. Ongoing training throughout patrol group sessions helped to maintain skill levels, while refreshing and introducing new initiatives for patrol members. Stuart Matthews Patrol Group 2 took out patrol group of the year and Patrol Group 4 were the winners at the Patrol Club Championships which was again attended well in trying conditions. Thank you, Terry, and team, for your hard work delivering another patrol season.



Training

Our training team lead by Chief Instructor Stewart Lockie provided many training courses throughout the season including Award Requalification's, SRC, Bronze Medallion, Radio Operator Certificate, Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation, Advanced Resus, Side by Side Vehicle, Inflatable Rescue Boat Driver, and Crew training. It sounds like a lot of work, and it is, and we are in the fortunate position to deliver these courses at the club due to our dedicated training team. We also had members complete their Training Officer Certificate that enables other courses to be completed in house. All these elements are vital in enabling the club to fulfill our LSV obligations on patrol and at carnivals. There are still opportunities to increase skills within patrol groups so important awards and roles are not left to a vital few. I encourage all members to consider completing their Bronze Medallion and becoming part of a patrol group and enjoy all that Life Saving has to offer. The training lead by Stewart and his team is of the highest quality and paid for by the club. Thank you, Stewart and team, for your dedication, effort and the time you put in to deliver training for the season.

Membership

Our membership continues to grow at the Mornington Life Saving Club with an 14% growth for the 2022-23 season seeing our membership base increase from 938 to 1074 members. I would like to thank all our members for their engagement, support and for being part of the Mornington Life Saving Club. We will continue to strive to provide new opportunities for our members to enjoy and participate in.

Nippers

With the lifting of Covid restrictions our under 6-13 Nipper program was able to get back into full swing starting in November and led by Nipper Captain Ange Seaburgh for the third season. The 2022-23 season saw participant numbers grow by 10% from 346 to 383 Nippers hitting the sand at Mills Beach every Sunday morning until March and representing the club at a number of carnivals including states held at Warrnambool on the March long weekend. A big thanks to the 32 Age Managers and Admins who did a tremendous job delivering another fantastic Nipper program and to the parent helpers each week that enable to the sessions to be completed so smoothly. Starfish Nippers continued to be part of our program and we thank Jo Morel, Clare Hendy and Jess Pinkett for their involvement.

I would also like to thank Tash Carah who had the uniform store running like a well oiled machine with her team of helpers keeping all our members uniform requirements up to date including a number of new additional items.



Seniors

The Senior program continues to go from strength to strength led by Senior Captain Simon Williams providing an engaging mix of summer training and events that our youth and senior ranks participated in enthusiastically. This year our senior program grew by 20% with 80 seniors up from 65 with a mix coming from our strong junior program and new arrivals to the club. Thanks to the Hendy family who managed the difficult task of fitting senior mals and ski's into the limited storage space we have available.

Sport & Coaching

Harriet Brown continued in the position of Club Coach and Youth Mentor providing support and guidance for our Junior and Senior programs while writing all mid week training sessions and attending Mills Beach throughout the season.

Matt McConnell again did a tremendous job preparing our seniors with many sessions across Ski, Board, Iron and Running through a mix of afternoon and morning sessions. He was well supported by Simon Williams and Adam McCrow who ran a number of sessions each week to share the load. Open water swimming was well attended with Lisa McConnell, Jeremy Warner and Ange Seaburgh at the helm. Shane Tatham's multiple sessions across a mid week senior paddle and his magic with the Belt & Reel again saw enthusiastic numbers maintaining their skills or improving their craft. Thanks again to our Senior Admin Jane Degg who fulfilled the important task of organizing all roles through a full competition season.

As numbers in our Nipper program continued to grow the need for more resource was recognized and provided an opportunity to split the Nipper Captain role creating a Competition Coordinator position with Adrian Lynch taking the helm. Adrian played the important role of organizing all things junior sport and carnival, while running a number of surf training sessions and coaching mid week iron sessions. We welcomed Travis Sutton into the role of Junior Board Coach where he did a great job running our Tuesday and Thursday board sessions that were well attended. Mid week running was held at Mornington Athletics Track under the coaching of Alistair Tait and our Youth Instructor Team continued to support at both water and running training. Thanks to Kelly Parrish who managed filling all volunteer carnival roles and Liz Johnston who manages all junior entries into carnivals.

It was fantastic to have a full carnival season that enabled training to begin in August prior to our Mooloolaba Camp in September which is a great launchpad for the season ahead. While LSV carnival numbers were generally down for the season, Mornington was always well represented across Junior and Senior level. This year we saw 114 Nippers represent the Green Machine at carnivals with 38 Seniors and 3 Masters. We had sensational results at the state championships where our Junior team finishing 3rd in the state at the competition held at Warrnambool. The Seniors also had a fantastic weekend at Ocean Grove finishing 4th on a countback – the best result our senior team has had at State Championships.

Another highlight of the year were two of our seniors being chosen to represent the state. Following a great season the year before where he was awarded LSV Junior Beach Athlete of the year, Seb Jaspers was selected to represent Victoria in the Youth team at the national championships held on the Gold Coast as a beach competitor where he performed strongly. We also had a state representative in Pool Lifesaving with Massimo Lancia chosen to represent Victoria and continue his fantastic journey in life saving where he grabs every opportunity with both hands - Congratulations Seb and Mas.

Thank you to all our coaches who put in a massive amount of work to bring our sport team together and well prepared for the competition season. We should be very proud of our State Championship



results across both Junior and Seniors and I look forward to how we can continue to develop in the season ahead.

Schools Program

Chiara McAuley again led our Schools Program for the 22-23 season. The program continues to be a highlight for the schools that attend with significant interest from new schools who hear about the program and all available spaces were filled quickly. Thank you to Chiara for your hard work and the regular support from Kelly Parrish, Jacqui Morrow, Kate Quinn and Mark Cornish as well as all the members who assisted with Water Safety to bring the program to life. The School's Program is important to the club financially but also as a function for schools in the local community and will continue to be focus into the future.

An incident occurred while the program was being run where Kelly Parrish, Jacqui Morrow and Kate Quinn had to leap to action to save an elderly man caught in the rip on the blue stone wall. If it wasn't for their fast action and courage, a negative outcome would have occurred. Another example of where our members go above and beyond to provide a safe water environment for our community and provided a lifelong lesson to the school children in attendance about being safe around the water. Well done team!

Fund Raising

Fund raising activities are extremely important in providing vital funds to support our programs. As we come out of Covid, several activities we have previously participated in to build funds have been slow to return. A positive for the season was the ability to run the well supported Mornington LSC Twilight Swim. After having to cancel the last two seasons, it was fantastic to again have this major event on our calendar running at Mills Beach in January. Thanks to Kieran McAuley who delivered another great event and strong financial contribution to the club.

The Kiosk continues to be a vital source of funds for the club and big thanks to Xiara McFarlane and Melinda Neilson who delivered a fantastic outcome for the summer while refreshing the large crowds that visited Mills Beach. BBQ John was back and firing with his famous Sunday BBQ again delivering a great result and well supported by all our members. I would like to thank all our sponsors for the 2022-23 season and look forward to partnering again in 2023-24. Please reach out if there is a way you can help support the club for the season ahead.

Summary

As president, I am extremely proud of what we achieved in 2022-23 as we got back to some normality following a difficult couple of years. As a club, our membership grew and more Nippers learnt important water skills over summer, our patrol team dedicated more hours than before patrolling Mills Beach, our Junior and Senior sports teams delivered sensational results for all the hard work that is put in, we were able to bring back Iconic events to Mills Beach for the community to participate in and we have continued to act financially responsible to build the club for the future. The can-do attitude of the committee is what drives these outcomes and engagement within the membership is what helps the club to keep moving forward.

I would like to thank everyone at the Mornington Life Saving Club for their support of me and am really looking forward to season 2023-24 with the new committee excited for the future. I am blown away each season by the enthusiasm exhibited by our patrollers as they go about their business of keeping the beachgoers safe. Each patrol has its own unique style of keeping everyone motivated and spirits high and the friendly rivalry is going strong! As a patrolling team we completed 55 patrols, patrolling over 3,400 hours at Mills beach this season.

MLSC NIPPER CAPTAINS REPORT 2022 - 2023

What another brilliant year for the Mornington Life Saving Club. Congratulations to everyone on what was a great season.

<u>Mooloolaba -</u> The season began with an amazing week at sunny Mooloolaba. What a great time was had by all! Great weather, training, catching up with friends, training and more catching up with friends. It's such a good week for our nippers. I enjoy watching their friendships and confidence grow over the week. Don't forget to book for this September.

Sunday Nippers

Our Sunday nippers sessions began on Sunday 20th November. We had 377 (U6–U13) nippers enrolled. Our Under 6's and 7's had 75 nippers in their group and Under 8's who had 55. Our program was delivered by a team of 32 age managers, assistant managers, and admins. They did an outstanding job teaching our nippers new skills and how to stay safe at the beach and in the water, all while encouraging participation and team spirit.

Participation numbers remained constant throughout the 16 sessions. Our Sunday sessions ranged from 145 nippers to 258 nippers on the beach. Numbers were mostly over 200 with the holiday program attracting 134-171 nippers. Our season finished on Sunday 5th March.

Contribution by Seniors

A group of seniors again introduced our U6s to the fantastic sport of life saving. It is a real asset having our seniors give back to the club and pass on their vast knowledge and skills.
